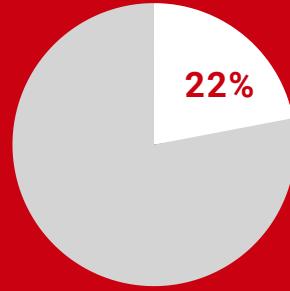

Work Relationships

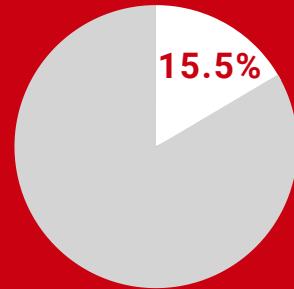

You are a valued member of any team, and you are a much needed part of any exceptional team.

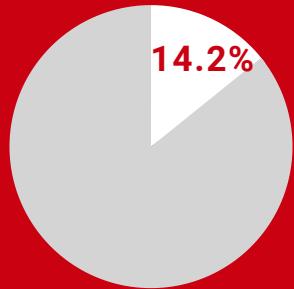
Parental Relationships

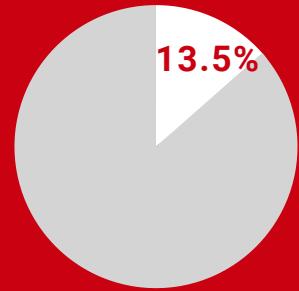
Parental Relationships

You are great to have when better is what is needed, but not as great to have when better is unnecessary!

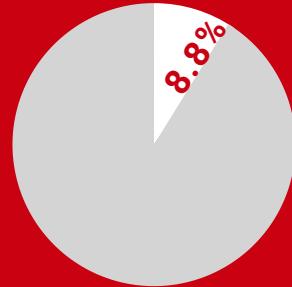

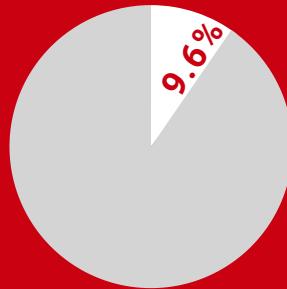
Parental Relationships

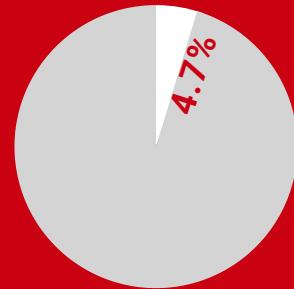

Work Relationships

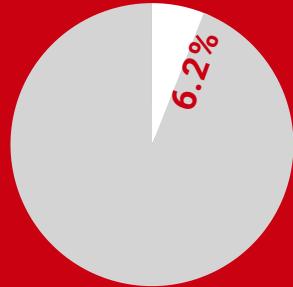

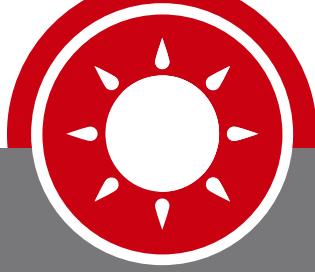

Work Relationships

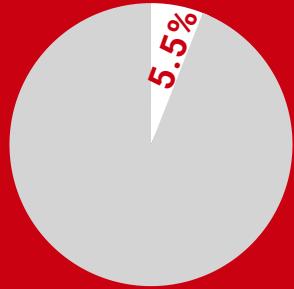

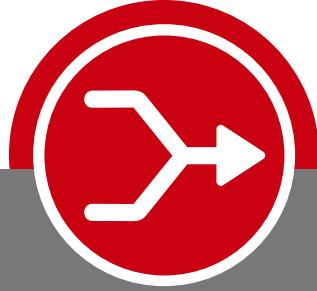
